LABOR LAW CONDITIONS UNDER THE ILO'S CORE CONVENTIONS

- The conditions aim to ensure that the manufacturer has effective risk management regarding workers' rights in accordance with the ILO's core conventions in its own operations and in the supply chain of the subcontractors who directly participate in fulfilling the contract.
- ILO's eight core conventions on forced labor, child labor, discrimination, freedom of association and the right to organize
- Equal pay for equal work regardless of gender. Discrimination in employment and occupation
- In cases where the ILO's core conventions are in breach of national law, the supplier shall take reasonable steps to comply with international rules
- Offering favorable working conditions and working conditions can mean that the company becomes more attractive, the brand is strengthened and competitiveness increases

We follow Sweden's haulage companies' list of approved transport companies. Through Fair transport, Sveriges Åkeriföretag together with transport companies has brought together the entire transport industry to take responsibility for sustainable transport.

- The idea is simple: If you buy a Fair Transport in the future, you are not just buying a transport from a haulage company that lives up to legal requirements in terms of road safety, emissions and working environment. You also buy a transport from a haulage company that measures and openly reports and takes responsibility for continuous improvements
- Fair Transport must guarantee a sustainable deal, both for those who sell and buy transports but also for the end customer who buys what has been transported. This means that transport-selling companies deliver a sustainability promise that is demonstrated through ongoing follow-up

We follow the procurement authority's list of hazardous chemicals and in step one focus on the following areas:

- Emollients
- Formaldehyde
- Water-repellent treatments
- Metals in finished leather and leather
- Heavy metals in color that are allergenic and carcinogenic

DURABLE METALS

Reduce the use of, in order to completely give up in the long run:

- Rare metals
- Politically sensitive metals
- Require the supplier to have traceable metals in their production
- Mercury, cadmium, arsenic and lead

PURE AND REFINABLE PACKAGING

- Bioplastics are made from biologically produced raw materials, such as starch from corn, sugar or cellulose. Bioplastics can be divided into two different categories. One part is biodegradable plastic, while it is about the raw material that the plastic is made of being renewable or made of some biomaterial. Bioplastics that are degradable are converted to carbon dioxide and water during the process.
- Minimize the use of packaging materials such as plastic and cardboard
- Reuse your own materials for packaging
- If plastic must be present, use bioplastic

PROPER RECYCLING

- Create conditions for being able to recycle the various fractions / waste that arise
- Take responsibility for ensuring that your waste is recycled correctly
